At Beverly, we believe the heart of our sport lies in its grassroots. Every rider begins somewhere, and our mission is to ensure that all competitors – whether stepping into their first crossrail class or preparing for larger circuits – have a place where they feel welcomed, supported, and celebrated.

This October, Beverly Equestrian hosts the Beverly Fall Classic (USEF Competition No. 346197), a USEF-rated, multi-discipline hunter and jumper competition in the heart of Hunt Country. Ticketed schooling opens Friday, October 2, with competition Saturday and Sunday, October 3-4, 2026.

Building on our local show series and November Finals, the Fall Classic extends the same values of accessibility, organization, and community into a rated environment. Divisions span the full entry-level ladder – from crossrails and short stirrup through the open warm-ups – up to 1.25m jumpers and hunters to 3'0", so every rider has a rung to reach for. Our venue has been thoughtfully designed to support this mission. Beverly features permanent stabling, all-weather arenas, a sweeping derby field, manicured schooling areas, and elegant viewing decks. Competitors can expect a polished, professional atmosphere, attentive management, and a championship-level experience.

The Beverly Fall Classic is designed for all levels:

- Grassroots riders gain a pathway into rated sport.
- Seasoned competitors enjoy a high-quality, competitive venue in Hunt Country.
- All riders share in a community-focused, championship atmosphere.

Beverly's stabling offers matted 10' x 10' stalls in permanent barns, with generous covered aisles, lighting, and easy trailer access. Permanent stalls are ready on-site and available first come, first served; tent stalls with doors can be provided for those who prefer a traditional setup, but must be reserved in advance. All stall counts and consumables are ordered online through Showgrounds Live.

Permanent Stabling Features

- Matted permanent stalls with soft padding throughout the aisles and facility for comfort and safety.
- Spacious permanent restrooms.
- Easy access to the show office.
- Convenient wash-lines with proper drainage outside the stalls.
- Generous covered aisle room with hardware and lighting throughout.
- One-way asphalt drive around the entire barn for easy trailer drop-off and stall access.
- Manure disposal areas close by.

Bedding & Feed

Hay, grain, and bedding may be purchased online or through the show office; shavings are \$15 per bag. Bedding must be purchased through the show's preferred vendor – no commercial feed or bedding source may deliver on the show grounds. Any off-site shavings will incur a \$25 manure-disposal fee per stall. Bedding on straw or with no bedding at all is prohibited except for a documented health need, with prior approval of Management.

Move-In & Reservations

Move-in begins at 7 AM on Friday, October 2 (schooling day); off-hour arrival or departure is allowed only with prior approval of Management and may be subject to a staffing fee. Reserve stabling and order consumables at ShowgroundsLive.com. Permanent stalls require no special reservation beyond standard show entry; tent stalls are limited and must be reserved in advance. Stalls are not transferable or sublettable except within the same trainer group.

Stall Doors

Permanent stalls are provided without doors. Portable stall doors may be rented for \$50 per door, or you may bring your own. Hardware and sizing specifications are posted at beverlyequestrian.com.

Use at Your Own Risk

Stabling and all facilities are used at the exhibitor's own risk. Stalls, portable doors, and hardware are provided as-is. Exhibitors are responsible for inspecting their assigned stall and any door or hardware – whether rented or their own – before use, for installing any door safely and correctly, and for using the stall and facilities safely. Report any stall part in need of repair to the Stable Office before use; absent such notice, the assigned stall is deemed safe by the exhibitor. Beverly Equestrian, LLC, the facility, and their officials and employees are not responsible for any loss, injury, or damage arising from the use of stalls, portable doors, or other facilities.

JUMPER SPECIFICATIONS

Class specifications. All jumper classes are conducted under current USEF rules. Management reserves the right to combine, divide, or cancel classes if entries warrant.

Classic qualification. To compete in any Classic, horse and rider must have completed at least one class at the same height section during the competition.

Classic purses. If fewer than eight (8) horses compete in Class 655 or Class 755, the class is run for a reduced purse of \$750 and \$1,250 respectively, distributed by the same six-place schedule; the number of places paid will not exceed the number of horses completing the class.

Speed Stake. The \$2,500 Beverly Speed Stake at 1.20m is a feature class, not a Classic – it is open to all horses and riders and no qualifying class is required. Scored under Table II, Sec. 2.1. If fewer than five (5) horses compete, the class is run for a total purse of \$1,000, distributed by the same six-place schedule (\$300 · \$220 · \$150 · \$130 · \$100 · \$100); the number of places paid will not exceed the number of horses completing the class.

Nomination fee. None.

Ties. Ties involving first place are jumped off. Ties not involving first place are decided on time in the first round unless otherwise stated.

Cross-entry (Zone 3). Jr/Am 1.0m–1.05m and 1.10m–1.15m combinations may cross-enter between those divisions but may enter only one Classic. 1.0m–1.05m riders may not cross-enter above 1.15m; 1.10m–1.15m riders may not cross-enter above 1.25m at the same competition.

Take2 Thoroughbred. Jumper fences 1.0–1.05m. Open to Thoroughbreds registered with The Jockey Club or eligible for Jockey Club registration.

General Rules (Jumpers). Time allowed. Based on a speed of 382 yards per minute unless otherwise noted, and may be adjusted.

Attire. Proper attire is required per USEF. Solid or tactful polo shirts are acceptable for non-Classic classes; no t-shirts, sleeveless, or scoop-neck shirts. Riders should be neatly turned out.

Numbers. Office-issued numbers must be worn on the rider's back or clearly displayed on the horse; small bridle or martingale numbers are not acceptable.

45-second rule. Observed in all jumper classes and Classics.

Jump order. Per USEF JP111.2. Riders must declare the day prior by 4pm and ensure they are on the jump order before the class starts.

Draw reins / German martingales. May not be used in any class restricted to ponies, Juniors, and/or Amateurs, or by age of horse; may be used only in a conventional manner when schooling or in classes with no prize money offered at 1.20m or below; not on ponies when ridden by a Junior. No other head-setting devices (chambon, etc.) are permitted.

Welfare & Schooling. No poling or offsets on the grounds. Excessive use of force or striking a horse in the head, neck, or in front of the girth, results in disqualification. Disregard of the schooling rules results in elimination and forfeiture of that class's fees; officials and the Steward may issue charges or warning cards.

Championships. Awarded in Junior/Amateur sections only.

HUNTER SPECIFICATIONS

The rated sections are official USEF point competitions for USEF National and must be USEF Zone Horse of the Year Award programs. All hunter classes judged on performance and soundness. Courses of at least eight fences with changes of direction, simulating hunt-field obstacles. Handy courses may include natural obstacles, a trot fence, and a fence to lead over.

Adult Amateur Hunter (3'0"). Ridden by an amateur with a valid Amateur Card. Fences 3'0".

Children's Hunter (3'0"). Open to horses ridden by juniors. Fences 3'0".

General. Course of no less than eight fences; spreads not to exceed height. Judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness. Sections may be combined if fewer than 4 entries.

Combinations. NAL: if fewer than 6 entries in a Classic section, classics combine. WIHS: if fewer than 8 entries one hour before, they combine. Points awarded per ribbon won when combined.

Classic rounds. Classics count toward NAL and WIHS. Prize distribution – \$100 purse: 33/22/15/12/10/8; \$500 purse: 165/110/75/60/50/40 (six places).

Order of go / attire / ribbons. Riders/trainers check in with the gate official and select rotations. Proper attire required in all divisions. Ribbons 1st-6th unless otherwise specified.

Opportunity Hunters

Short and Long Stirrup run as GR821 Opportunity classes. Participants competing only in Opportunity classes are exempt from USEF / affiliate membership and non-member / show-pass fees. Fences 2'0". Riders may not show in any other class at this competition, and riders with rated-hunter or eq-medal experience in the last five years are excluded. Ribbon-focused; no USEF or affiliate points. Opportunity classes are capped at 10% of total classes or 20, whichever is less.

Equine Health Entry Requirements

UPON ARRIVAL, ALL HORSES MUST HAVE AND PROVIDE:

Negative Coggins – within twelve months

A negative Coggins test valid within 365 days of the ending date of the show, including horses that originate from Virginia. All horses entering the show grounds must have a negative Coggins on file, and the Coggins must reflect the horse's show name. Please bring a paper copy for our file.

Proof of Vaccination

A signed statement from the attending veterinarian that the horse has been vaccinated against the following: Equine Influenza within 6 months (180 days) of each show, and EHV-1 and EHV-4 within 6 months (180 days) of each show. If a vaccination will expire during the show, the horse must receive its new vaccination before being issued a competition number.

Virginia Health Certificate (Certificate of Veterinary Inspection)

The Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services requires each horse originating from out of state to have a valid Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Certificate) dated within 30 days of entry into Virginia.

Presentation of Health Requirements

Equine Health Entry Requirements are required for all horses entering the show grounds, both showing and non-showing. These documents must be filed in the show office before any competition numbers will be issued, and random checks will occur. Keep a copy of all records in an easily accessible spot; the horse's registered (show) name must appear on all required papers.

Any horse not accompanied by these documents will be directed to the Show Veterinarian to obtain the required documents and/or vaccinations, and/or will be placed in quarantined stabling until the proper documents are obtained. Any horse showing signs of fever, illness, or stress is subject to examination by show staff and/or the Show Veterinarian, who may, at their sole discretion, place the horse in quarantined stabling or take further action if deemed necessary.

Ship-ins

All ship-ins (showing or non-showing) must file the proper health requirements in the show office and be prepared to present those records at any time while on the grounds. Ship-ins/day-trippers are subject to random checks by show staff. If proper records are not immediately available, the horse(s) must remain under show-staff observation until the paperwork is presented, or will be asked to leave the grounds.

Fever / infectious disease

Any horse on grounds with a temperature of 101.5°F or higher must be reported to the official show veterinarian. Upon veterinary examination, if diagnostic testing is deemed necessary, testing will be conducted at the owner's expense. If the veterinarian suspects infectious disease after inspection, the horse will be required to go to isolation or off the property.

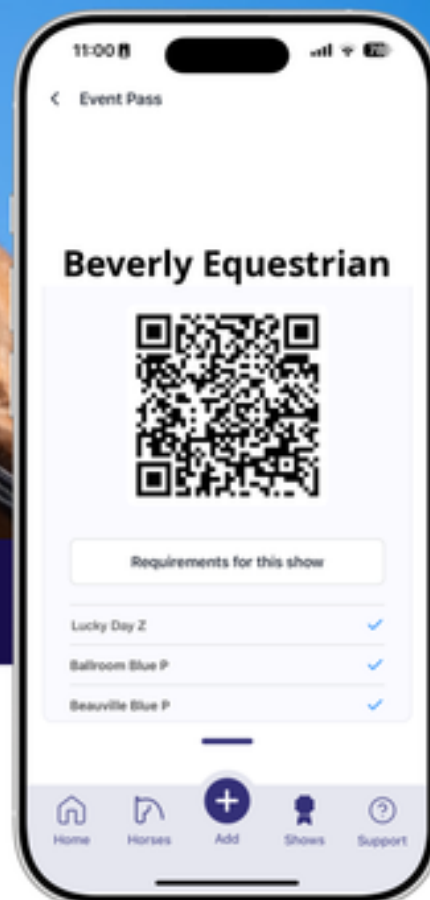

Management Rules & Policies

MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY & LIABILITY

BEVERLY EQUESTRIAN, LLC ("MANAGEMENT") RESERVES THE RIGHT TO INTERPRET ALL QUESTIONS AND CONDITIONS IN REGARD TO, ARISING OUT OF, OR INCIDENT TO THE SHOW WITHOUT CLAIM FOR DAMAGES OR RECOURSE OF ANY KIND. ALL QUESTIONS NOT COVERED IN THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS SHALL BE DECIDED BY MANAGEMENT IN ITS SOLE DISCRETION, AND ITS DECISION SHALL BE FINAL.

Management reserves the right to limit entries in any class, section, or division; to refuse, accept conditionally, or cancel any entry; to disqualify any rider or exhibitor; to prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, add a dotted line, cancel or combine any unfilled class, or reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; and to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants.

Every horse entered is under the control of Management, but Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. It is a condition of entry that each exhibitor hold the show and its officials, employees, directors, officers, and sponsoring entities, and the facility at which the show is held, blameless for any loss or accident to the exhibitor's horse(s), employee(s), or equipment arising from sickness, fire, or any other cause.

Errors & Omissions

While every effort has been made to ensure accuracy, Management assumes no liability for typographical or other errors in this prize list. Any significant error or change will be disclosed to affected exhibitors upon acceptance of entry and otherwise in accordance with USEF rules.

WARNING – Virginia Equine Activity Liability Act. Under the Code of Virginia (Va. Code § 3.2-6200 et seq.), an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the intrinsic dangers of equine activities. Exhibitors, owners, and their agents are personally responsible for damage or injury caused by themselves, their employees, agents, horses, or dogs, and are strongly advised to carry their own third-party liability insurance.

Governing Law, Venue & Claims Deadline

These Rules and Policies, and all disputes arising out of or relating to the show or Management's operation of it, are governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, without regard to conflict-of-laws principles. The parties agree to attempt to resolve any dispute informally; failing that, exclusive venue for any action shall lie in the state courts located in Fauquier County, Virginia. Any objection to show charges must be made in writing within seventy-two (72) hours after the close of the show; charges not disputed within that period are final. Any other claim must be brought within one (1) year.

Entry Procedure

- Entries must be submitted online via Showgrounds Live (ShowgroundsLive.com). Faxed, mailed, emailed, or texted entries will not be accepted.
- Visa, MasterCard, Discover & American Express are accepted. A 3.99% convenience fee is added to all credit card transactions.
- A valid credit card is required on file at the time of entry. By submitting an entry, the exhibitor authorizes Management to hold the card on authorization and to charge it as provided in these rules. Back numbers will not be issued until a valid card is on file.
- The Facility Fee, Office Fee, stabling, and all other applicable fees must be submitted with the entry, or the entry will be considered late.
- Each entry must be complete, including Prize Money Payee, all USEF/USHJA numbers, and required signatures.
- Signatures. No entry will be accepted, and no back number issued, unless the entry is signed by the exhibitor and, for a minor, by the minor's parent or legal guardian. The signature of an unrelated person will not be accepted.

No entry deposit. There is no entry deposit for the Fall Classic. An exhibitor's commitment is secured by the valid credit card on file and the non-refundable Office Fee.

Entry Policy

- Entries will not be accepted until all previous balances with Beverly Equestrian are settled.
- Entries received after the Closing Date, Tuesday, September 22, 2026, are late and subject to the Post-Entry Fee. (Late entries remain open, subject to availability.)
- Accounts must be closed at the end of the show. Exhibitors are encouraged to close out in person; those who do not, automatically authorize Management to close the account using the card on file. By submitting an entry, exhibitors consent to this close-out procedure.
- Billing adjustments will be considered only if submitted in writing within 72 hours after the show concludes.
- These scratch and refund policies are Management's stated refund policy under USEF GR912.1. Postponement or cancellation for weather, air quality, or other causes beyond Management's control is governed by the Weather / Uncontrollable Event / Postponement Policy below.

Entry Policy ^{cont'd}

All accounts must be paid in full and closed out no later than one (1) hour after the conclusion of the competition. By submitting an entry, the owner, rider, trainer, and agent jointly and severally agree to pay all fees and charges incurred and authorize Management to charge any unpaid balance – including added and day-of charges – to the credit card provided with the entry. Prize money and awards are applied to the exhibitor's account and released only after the account is paid in full. Any account not settled by the deadline above is subject to a \$50 close-out fee per entry. Submission of an entry constitutes agreement to these terms and to the Federation Entry Agreement.

Billing Policy

- All entry, stall, feed, and other charges are to be paid in full by the end of the show.
- Prize money is applied only if the payee has provided a valid SSN or Federal Tax ID and complete valid mailing address. Net prize-money credits are issued as a check within 30 days as required by USEF, valid for 60 days from issuance; re-issuance must be requested within 90 days.
- At year end, tax-eligible recipients receive an IRS Form 1099-MISC reporting taxable prize-money income.

Add / Scratch / Change

Any add, scratch, change, or complete show scratch must be made through Showgrounds Live (or in the show office on an official form) and received before the applicable class or show begins. Scratching "at the gate" is not an official scratch. Once a class or division begins it may not be scratched, except for a Veterinary Scratch – processed in the show office on the day or before the class with the Official Show Vet's certificate received that day; the applicable fee still applies. A class that has closed may not be scratched.

- **Day-of Scratch – No charge** (covered by the Office Fee).
- **Add Class – \$15** (no charge if added before 4 PM the day before).
- **Add Classic – \$15** (may go first in the order of go).
- **Horse Substitution – \$60** (\$50 scratched entry + \$10 substitute entry).
- **Shown but Not Entered – \$20** per class.
- Any entry into a Classic must have competed in at least one class in that section to be eligible.

Combining, Dividing, or Canceling Classes

The decision to combine, cancel, or divide classes is made at Management's discretion within one hour of the close of the show office the night before the class, and is noted on the "How Many" schedule online. No other notice is required or given. A class combined for insufficient entries will not be re-divided day-of; a class offered as split may be combined day-of if scratches warrant; a class cancelled for insufficient entries will not be reinstated day-of.

Refunds

- Pre-paid fees are refunded only on a written scratch received on or before the Closing Date (Sept. 22), less the non-refundable \$65 Office Fee. No refunds are given for fees on entries scratched after the Closing Date.
- Stall fees are non-refundable as of the Closing Date; the office fee and tent stall fees are non-refundable in all cases.
- Eligible refunds are issued within 30 days of the close of the show.
- The Office Fee is non-refundable in all cases. Billing questions and refund requests will not be considered more than 72 hours after the show concludes.

Weather / Uncontrollable Event / Postponement Policy

If weather, air quality, an outbreak of a communicable equine disease (such as equine herpesvirus/EHV), or other circumstances beyond Management's control – including but not limited to fire, storm, flood, or a facility emergency – require Management to postpone or cancel this competition or any portion of it, as determined by Management or as directed by USEF or state animal-health authorities, entries will be honored on the rescheduled date. Any competitor unable to attend the rescheduled date – or whose classes are not held – will receive a full-value credit covering all fees paid (entry and class fees, and the Facility Fee), cross-honored at Management's monthly recognized shows and at the next running of this competition, and valid for one year from the original competition date. Credits are issued automatically; no request is required. A competitor who cannot use the credit may instead request a refund on hardship grounds by emailing the show office at beverlyclassic@gmail.com. Beverly will then refund all prepaid fees for services not used (including entry and class fees, the Facility Fee, and any unused permanent-stall fees). Federation fees (USEF/USHJA) are a pass-through Beverly owes only if the competition runs; for any horse that does not compete, they are returned in all cases and are not included in a credit. The \$65 office fee and tent stall fees are non-refundable in all cases and are never returned. This policy applies only when conditions beyond Beverly's control cause a postponement or cancellation. A competitor who chooses not to attend a competition held as scheduled follows the standard scratch and refund rules above.

Move-In / Move-Out & Office Hours

Move-in begins at 7 AM on the Friday before the competition (schooling day). Off-hour arrival or departure is allowed only with prior approval of Management and may be subject to a staffing fee. The show office is open each show day from 7 AM until 4 PM, unless otherwise posted or indicated.

Stabling

Permanent stalls are approximately 10' x 10' with mat floors and no doors; portable doors are available for rent while supplies last (\$50). Tent stalls with doors are \$375. Stalls are available first come, first served. Stall fees are non-refundable after the Closing Date; tent stall fees are non-refundable in all cases. Cancellations are governed by the Weather / Uncontrollable Event / Postponement Policy. Any stall order made by any method is an official order and payable. Stalls are not transferable or sublet except within the same trainer or barn group. Shavings are available through the show's preferred vendor. Straw or other bedding is permitted only by prior approval of Management for a documented health need; a clean-up fee may apply. Off-site shavings incur a \$25 manure-disposal fee per stall. Notify the show office of any stall part in need of repair; absent notice, the assigned stall is deemed safe by the exhibitor.

Required Health Documents

On arrival, every horse must present a negative Coggins within 12 months and proof of EHV-1 and EHV-4 vaccination within 6 months; out-of-state horses must carry a 30-day interstate health certificate. A USEF-approved microchip must be on file with USEF/USHJA as required. Non-showing horses on the grounds are subject to the same requirements.

Services & Feed

- Hay, grain, and bedding may be purchased online or through the show office. No commercial feed or bedding source may deliver on the show grounds.
- Trainer's Splits: submitted by close of business Friday; only items billed by the show (feed, bedding, tack stalls, etc.) are split; dollar amounts only, rounded up; uncollected splits revert to the trainer for payment.

Non-Negotiable Checks / Credit Cards

Returned checks or declined/disputed cards, for any reason, are assessed a penalty of \$50 or 10% of the face value, whichever is greater, plus any bank fees. Upon notification, the exhibitor has three days to pay in full in certified funds. Sanctioning organizations are notified on failure to pay within three days. A service fee equal to 18% per annum accrues after 30 days. First-time returned checks are automatically redeposited; a declined card is resubmitted. A closed account, stop payment, incorrect card information, or chargeback is turned over to sanctioning organizations immediately.

Repeat occurrences. Any party who has submitted a returned check, or disputed or charged back a card, must pre-pay in full for future stalls and entries before the show begins. Cash-only may be required.

Prize Money

Prize money is applied to entries when conditions are met. The payee defaults to the Owner if a recipient is not provided on the entry. A valid SSN or Federal Tax ID and complete mailing address must be provided to release payment. If not provided by the end of the show, prize money in excess of the show bill is withheld until provided, and is forfeited if not provided within 90 days; prize money will not be reissued after 90 days. Prize money is withheld where the IRS has notified a discrepancy in payee name or tax ID, or where an outstanding balance exists on the account. Prize money won by foreign exhibitors is subject to 30% U.S. withholding; a Form W-8BEN is required prior to payment. Prize money is awarded through 6th place in hunter classes and 6th or 8th place in jumper classes; payout is based on on-time entries. A class with fewer than three entries will not award prize money.

Social Media Policy

Beverly encourages positivity in the use of social media and urges those posting about Beverly Equestrian, its management, shows, exhibitors, officials, equine athletes, and others to exercise good judgment. We urge users to refrain from derogatory, offensive, inflammatory, or false comments about other athletes, trainers, Beverly Equestrian and its management, equine athletes, USEF, or any individual associated with Management's horse shows. Beverly Equestrian reserves the right to remove third-party content that violates this policy and, in extenuating circumstances, to block a user for repeated offenses.

USEF Rules & Membership Requirements

UNITED STATES EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

USEF Membership Statement

Life, senior active, and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempt from this requirement: (1) leadline; (2) exhibitions; (3) games and races; (4) classes for 4-H members; (5) walk-trot and academy classes (academy classes are limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); (6) USDF introductory-level tests, pas de deux, and quadrille classes; (7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Membership & Participation Requirements

The following must be in order before back numbers are issued. The exhibitor bears ultimate responsibility for proper registration of horse, owner, rider, and trainer, and for entering the horse under proper ownership where points are concerned.

- **Membership.** Each Owner, Rider, and Trainer must hold current USEF membership – or a non-member must pay the USEF Show Pass fee – to participate in Regular Competition classes (see the exemptions above). Where USEF/USHJA points are earned, current USHJA membership is also required.
- **USHJA show pass.** A \$30 non-USHJA-member show pass applies where required.
- **Amateur status.** Riders competing in Amateur or Adult sections must hold a current USEF Amateur Certification.
- **Microchip.** All horses competing in USEF Hunter, Jumper, and Equitation classes must have a USEF-approved microchip number on file with USEF and USHJA.
- **Horse recording / registration.** Horses must be recorded with USEF and registered with USHJA as required for the classes entered.
- **SafeSport.** Every USEF adult member (18 years or older) with a Competing Membership – and any junior who has reached their 18th birthday – must complete U.S. Center for SafeSport training before competing.

Statement as to Federation Fee

Per GR407.1-3, for every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation, a \$23 Federation Fee will be collected, of which \$15 is an Equine Drugs & Medication Fee to provide for research, inspection, and enforcement of the rules regarding the use of medications and drugs.

Safe Sport Statement

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP); more information is available at www.usef.org. Every USEF adult member (18 years of age or older) with a Competing Membership must complete SafeSport training, and junior members who have reached their 18th birthday must complete SafeSport. Failure to complete the training will disqualify a member from competing in any capacity until it is completed.

Motorized Vehicle Statement

Minors who do not hold a valid driver's license permitting them to operate a motorized vehicle in their state of residence may not operate a motorized vehicle of any kind – including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles – on the competition grounds. Minors who hold a valid temporary license may operate such vehicles only when accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent, legal guardian, or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule is solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from that operation. Wheelchairs and other mobility-assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices that do not require a driver's license (including but not limited to Segways, hoverboards, and single-wheeled scooters), as determined by competition officials and management in their sole discretion, is prohibited on competition grounds.

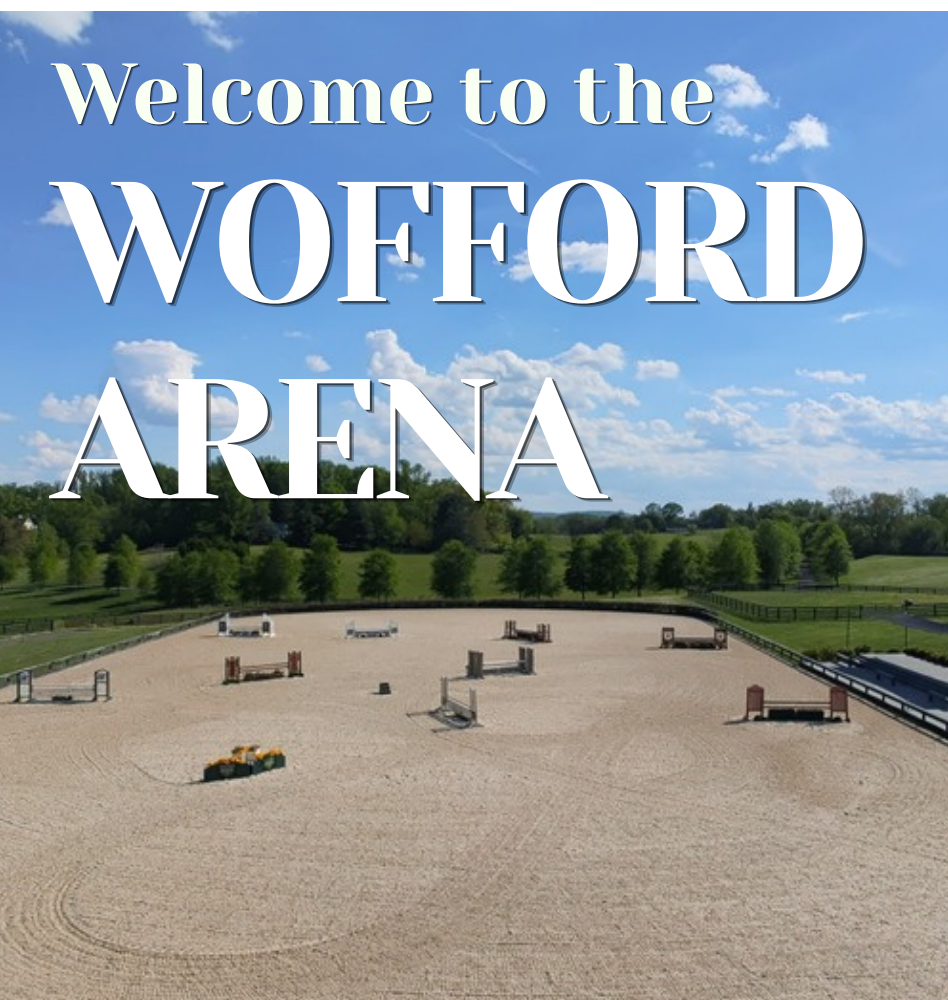

Visitor Policies

General Safety

- Virginia regulations prohibit smoking in all arenas, on trails, and in barns.
- No firearms or fireworks are permitted.
- Anyone involved in theft or destruction of property will be prosecuted.

Vehicles

- Speed limit is 10mph throughout venue and traffic and parking signs are strictly enforced.
- Every vehicle operator must have a valid driver's license and proof of insurance. Motorized vehicles may be operated only by licensed drivers, consistent with USEF GR1301.7 and the USEF Motorized Vehicle Statement (minors per that statement).
- Vehicles are not permitted on the grass.
- Scooters, bicycles, Segways, or hoverboards operated unsafely will result in a fine. Management reserves the right to restrict the operation of any vehicle on the premises.

Pets

- All pets must have current rabies inoculations as prescribed by the state of residency.
- All pets must be crated or leashed and under control at all times on the venue. Owners of unsecured pets will incur a \$100 fine, and owners are expected to clean up after their pets.
- Service dogs be identified as such. Dogs are not allowed in food-preparation, serving, or eating areas.

Alcohol

- All applicable ABC laws will be followed at events serving alcohol. Individuals not presenting proof of age when requested will not be served, and disorderly patrons will be removed from the premises.

General Facility Rules

- Shavings for each stall are available through Showgrounds Live. Straw or other bedding is permitted only by prior approval of Management.
- Exhibitors, trainers, and owners will respect "No Lunging" signs as posted in arenas.
- No horses may be stabled in trailers or tied out overnight.
- For the health and safety of all, nothing may be attached to or suspended from the electrical conduit in the barns.
- No trash or sharps may be disposed of in the manure pits. Sharps must be placed in the labeled containers in each barn; non-compliance carries a \$1,000 fine charged to the responsible party.
- Exhibitors who empty trash or manure into any assigned or unoccupied stall will be assessed a \$500 fine. Appropriate receptacles are available for both.
- **Damage.** Owners and exhibitors are responsible for any damage caused by them, their agents, or their employees to stalls, buildings, and other property on the show grounds, and will be billed accordingly.
- No camping.
- **Report** any loss, theft, accident, or disturbance to Management (beverlyclassic@gmail.com or the show office). Lost & Found is located at the show office.
- **Liability & authority.** Management's authority, the hold-harmless conditions of entry, and the errors-and-omissions and Virginia Equine Activity Liability Act provisions are set out in the General Information, Rules & Regulations (Entry Instructions) and govern this document.
- **Minors.** The parent or guardian of a minor holds Beverly Show Management and the facility harmless for any injury to the minor. Forged signatures will not be accepted.
- **Non-showing horses** must complete an entry agreement and liability statement and carry a back number before being ridden or schooled on the grounds; they are charged the \$100 Facility Fee and must have Coggins and vaccinations on file.

Animal Welfare & Emergency Care

All horses must be treated with kindness and respect; USEF rules governing the welfare of the horse and the use of whips are strictly enforced. No poling, offsets, or excessive use of the whip will be tolerated.

In the event of an acute and serious injury or illness of a horse on the competition grounds when the owner, trainer, or the owner's agent is not present, and after reasonable effort to contact that individual has been made, Management, in consultation with a licensed equine veterinarian, may authorize emergency veterinary treatment of the horse. Management and the veterinarian shall not be liable for any resulting costs, damages, losses, claims, or actions arising directly or indirectly from that treatment.

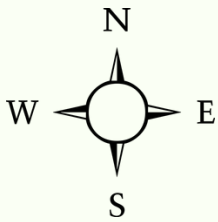

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and events at Beverly Equestrian, LLC ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. **RULES AND REGULATIONS:** I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. **ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK:** I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, (i) the propensity of an equine to behave in dangerous ways which may result in injury to the participant; (ii) the inability to predict an equine's reaction to sound, movements, objects, persons, or animals; and (iii) hazards of surface or subsurface conditions; (iv) the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; (v) loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; (vi) accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; (vii) facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); (viii) inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; (ix) situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and (x) other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers. ("Risks").

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK:

Under VA Code Ann. Sec 3.2-6200-6203, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. **ASSUMPTION OF RISK:** I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. **WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY:** In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (individually and collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

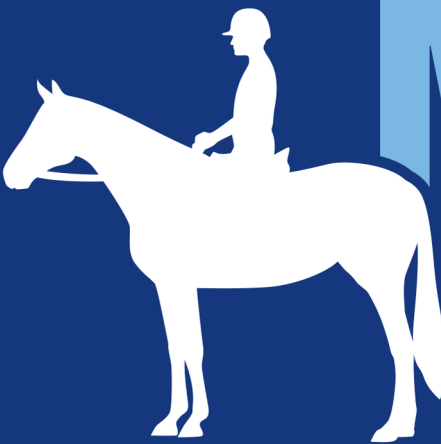

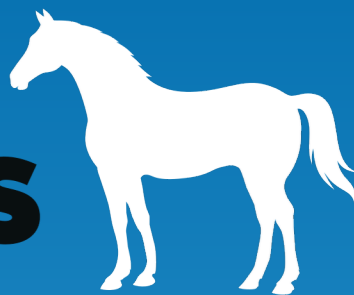

KNOW THE SIGNS

USEF HORSE WELFARE



See Guidelines



USEF has developed horse welfare guidelines based on the stoplight system to help us recognize acceptable or unacceptable interactions between horses and humans

GREEN

horse friendly

The horse appears happy, willing, and content.

The connection between horse and human is harmonious and in sync.

YELLOW

cautionary

Actions that cause you to pause and question whether they are acceptable.

Some actions may be acceptable for a very short period of time but may escalate to mistreatment if pressure or conflict increases in intensity.

RED

unacceptable OR not okay

Actions that make you think, "This is not okay."

Actions that make you immediately think,
"This behavior must stop."

Sometimes athletes can be acting in the red zone without even realizing it - these situations may be resolved by a licensed official interrupting the training, discussing the issue, and providing a verbal warning.

If you see an interaction that falls into the red zone, please alert an official to the situation and submit a report.
